(FS 99.021) Deadline for county office candidates to change party for the <b>2024</b> election cycle: <b>June 11, 2023</b>

Filing for Office Forms Required	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li><b>DS-DE 9 Appointment of Campaign Treasurer and Designation of Campaign Depository</b> is required to be filed with the SOE office <b>prior</b> to opening a campaign account, accepting or expending funds and reproducing petitions for circulation (FS 99.061, 99.095, 99.096)</li> <li><b>DS-DE 84 Statement of Candidate</b> is required to be filed within 10 days <b>after</b> Form DS-DE 9 has been filed with the SOE office (FS 106.023)</li> </ul>		
Petition Information	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li><b>DS-DE 104 Candidate Petition</b> is the petition format prescribed by the Division of Elections and shall be used by the candidate to reproduce petitions for circulation (FS 99.061, 99.095, 99.096)</li> <li><b>Before noon, May 13, 2024:</b> All petitions for verification must be submitted to the Supervisor of Elections office (FS 99.061, 99.095, 99.096, 99.097)</li> <li>The SOE shall be <b>paid in advance</b> the sum of <b>\$0.10</b> for each signature required to be verified (FS 99.097)</li> <li>If a candidate cannot pay such charges without imposing an undue burden on personal resources or on the resources otherwise available to the candidate, an <b>Affidavit of Undue Burden</b> may be filed with the Supervisor of Elections to have the signatures verified at no charge (FS 99.097)</li> <li>Prior to disposing of surplus funds in the campaign account, a candidate (excluding a write-in candidate) who qualified by the petition process and filed an <b>Affidavit of Undue Burden</b> to waive the petition signature verification fee, must reimburse the SOE the amount of the waived fee (FS 106.141)</li> </ul>
