2018 City of Gainesville Regular Election Early Voting to Begin March 10

GAINESVILLE, Fla. (March 5, 2018) — Early voting sites for the 2018 City of Gainesville Regular Election will be open from March 10 to March 17. Hours of operation are 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., except on Tuesday and Thursday, when locations will open from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.

Early voting locations, designated by the City of Gainesville, are as follows:

- Cone Park Library
 2801 East University Ave., Gainesville
- Millhopper Branch Library 3145 NW 43rd St., Gainesville
- Supervisor of Elections Office Josiah T. Walls Building
 515 N. Main St., Gainesville

Voters are required to present picture and signature identification before voting. Accepted forms of identification include Florida driver licenses, Florida identification cards, United States passports, debit or credit cards, military or student IDs, retirement center or neighborhood association IDs, public assistance IDs, veteran health IDs, concealed carry IDs, or government employee IDs. Voters may use two forms of identification to meet the requirement.

Registered voters who reside within Gainesville's city limits are able to vote in this election. The following seats on Gainesville's City Commission are up for election: At-Large Seat 1 and District 1. Election Day is March 20.

All city voters will be eligible to vote in the At-Large Seat 1 race. Only voters who live in District 1 will be able to vote in both races. A detailed map of all City of Gainesville Commission districts can be found at https://goo.gl/8Eeg24.

The deadline to request a vote-by-mail ballot is 5 p.m. Wednesday, March 14. Vote-by-mail ballots can be requested online, in person, or by phone, fax, mail or email. Until the deadline, vote-by-mail ballot requests will be filled as they are received. Any voter can sign up to vote by mail.
