2018 City of Gainesville Runoff Election Early Voting to Begin April 21

GAINESVILLE, Fla. (April 16, 2018) — Early voting sites for the 2018 City of Gainesville Runoff Election will be open from April 21 to April 28. Hours of operation are 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., except on Tuesday and Thursday, when locations will open from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.

Early voting locations, selected by the City of Gainesville, are as follows:

- Cone Park Library
2801 East University Ave., Gainesville
- Millhopper Branch Library
3145 NW 43rd St., Gainesville
- Supervisor of Elections Office
Josiah T. Walls Building
515 N. Main St., Gainesville

Voters are required to present picture and signature identification before voting. Accepted forms of identification include Florida driver licenses, Florida identification cards, United States passports, debit or credit cards, military or student IDs, retirement center or neighborhood association IDs, public assistance IDs, veteran health IDs, concealed carry IDs, or government employee IDs. Voters may use two forms of identification to meet the requirement.

Only registered voters who reside within District 1 of Gainesville's city limits are able to vote in this election. Election Day is May 1.
